5) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY SUPERVISOR KEEM, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUCILMEMBER MAJCHRZAK, TO WIT:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby approve the appointment of Courtney R. Vaccaro to the position of Police Officer (Probationary) in the Orchard Park Police Department, starting salary of \$53,730 effective August 3rd, 2018; and Andrew J. Kowalski to the position of Police Officer (Probationary) in the Orchard Park Police Department at the salary of \$53,730 effective August 4th, 2018.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

<u>Deborah Loury</u> spoke of the ponds near her home in Lyrica Park and was concerned that the Town is mowing the area around the pond only once a year and not picking up the clippings. She also notified the Town that the lights in the pond are not illuminating anymore. She inquired about her lawn being repaired after snow plow damage. She sent multiple emails and spoke with the Highway Superintendent but wasn't happy with the delay in services and did the repairs herself. She would also like to know when the trees promised to their neighborhood will be put in. They were to be planted last year. She was told they were already bought and will be put in in October. She is concerned about the tree's health after sitting for so long.

<u>Olena May</u> also lives in Lyrica Park and is concerned about the walking path around their homes. It is overgrown and needs to be maintained better.

<u>James Arlotta</u> spoke to the issue of public (bus) transportation in Orchard Park. He said as Orchard Park's population is increasing there has been no increase in availability of public transportation. He was upset that our taxes are not more directed to this area. He has filed a complaint with NYS Division of Human Rights regarding this issue and stated if you pay for a service you should have access to it and it would greatly benefit the Seniors.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

<u>Supervisor Keem</u> checked with Town Attorney John Bailey and discovered the Town has no control over the NFTA. We can write a letter requesting new routes but that is all. He also announced that the Orchard Park Bee had an article stating our Bond rating went up from an AA2 to an AA1 Bond rating. We have the highest bond rating in Erie County. This means we are handling our money well, we have good reserves, our pension plans are covered and health insurance is paid for, we are doing a good job with our conservative budgeting. We are presently reviewing every departments' budget and have to justify all spending. Also, we received a Records Management Grant for \$73,711 to help update and clean out old records. We were also given a grant from NYS Companion Animal Capitol Fund grant for \$100,575. This will update our animal control building.

Councilmember Gene Majchrzak welcomed the new Police Officers to Orchard Park.

<u>Chief of Police Mark Pacholic</u> stated there are two events at the stadium this weekend. Friday night The Bill's open practice will start at 6:15pm with fireworks after, Abbott Road will be closed from 3:15pm to 10:00pm. Sunday morning and afternoon The Drums on The Waterfront will be at the stadium, Abbott Road will be open.

<u>Highway Superintendent Fred Piasecki</u> said they are paving the roads that have been milled and repair of receivers will begin on August 7th. The site work on the Community Activity Center begun including clearing the roadway and building site. They hope to have everything hauled out by the end of this week and start stripping topsoil. Regarding Sonnett Drive, the Town has no responsibility regarding the lights around the pond and he will check into the mowing schedule for that area, they should be up to 2-3 times per year. The trees scheduled for fall planting are at the compost site, are being watered everyday by our staff there and are healthy.

<u>Town Engineer Wayne Bieler</u> stated the lights in the ponds at Lyrica Park are owned by the Homeowners association and are flashing lights that serve as geese deterrents. It did work for a while and was likely put in by Ryan Homes.
