Employees who take scheduled vacation and/or sick days during a workweek shall have those hours included in their total hours worked.

Overtime Calculation:

Overtime shall be calculated based on the total hours worked, including scheduled pre-approved paid absences.

The standard overtime rate (1.5 times the regular hourly rate) shall apply to all hours worked beyond 40 in a workweek; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this resolution be communicated to all non-union employees, HR personnel, and payroll administrators for implementation and adherence.

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department is requesting your approval of a Change Order #1 to the contract with Greenauer Blacktop Inc., for Community Activity Center Generator Installation Project (General Contract); and

WHEREAS, C&S Company's has modified the size of the concrete pad and associated fencing enclosure for generators, for the above mention project. The result of the modifications required is an increase in the amount of \$13,432.00; and

WHEREAS, if approved, this change order will increase the awarded Contract amount of \$157,300.00, to \$170,732.00. This is a net increase of 8.5%; and

WHEREAS, there is presently funding in AB018 Community Activity Senior Bocce/Generator \$80,352.00.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby approve Change Order #1 to the Contract with Greenauer Blacktop Inc., 391 French Road, West Seneca, New York 14224, for the Community Activity Center Generators Installation Project (General), as recommended by the Town Engineer.

New Business #8 Authorize the Town Supervisor to sign an agreement with TECsmith Inc. to provide professional sanitary sewer flow monitoring service for the Eaglebrook Drive Reconstruction Project

13) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MOMBREA, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARIANO, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department is currently awaiting final approval from the Erie County Department of Sewage Management (ECDSM) for the sanitary sewer portion of the reconstruction project. Approval is needed prior to the start of construction. In order to receive approval, the ECDSM is requiring a Down Stream Capacity Analysis to be completed. This analysis will verify that if the existing Erie County sanitary sewer trunk has the capacity required for our reconstruction project; and

WHEREAS, the Sanitary Sewer Department does not have the manpower available for this work nor the equipment anymore; and

WHEREAS, the initial set up cost to meet ECDSM requirements will be \$6,600.00 and include the installation of three nodes and weekly service for the first month. After the first month, there will be a weekly charge of \$1,125.00 for monitoring services until a half inch rain event occurs or 90 days of data has been collected; and

WHEREAS, there is currently funding allocated in account, G0009 Eaglebrook Sanitary Sewer \$276,353.00 for this work.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby authorize the Supervisor to sign an agreement with TECsmith, Inc., PO Box 95, Clarence, New York, 14031 to provide professional sanitary sewer flow monitoring for the Eaglebrook Drive Reconstruction Project, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

New Business #9 Approve the appointment of a Junior Engineer to the Engineering Department

14) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MOMBREA, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARIANO, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, on August 5, 2003 the Erie County Department of Personnel approved the Junior Engineer Position for the Town of Orchard Park based on job classifications and duties. On August 6, 2003, the Town Board created the Junior Engineer position for the Town of Orchard Park; and

WHEREAS, since then the Engineering Department has called Erie County for several available civil service titles and advertised for several titles for the replacement of employees. The Engineering Department has proposed for the past several years filling the Junior Engineer position with budget submittals. The Junior Engineer would assist with the increased technical workload associated with maintaining the Town's increasing/aging infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, minimum qualifications include graduation from a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department is pleased to inform you that after interviewing several candidates, we have concluded that the best-qualified individual for the position is Jonathan Gladding. Mr. Gladding will be performing entry level professional engineering work in the office or field in connection with design, inspection, maintenance and/or construction of civil engineering projects. Work includes complex technical duties that apply the principles of civil engineering to a variety of engineering problems either as a regular assignment or as a training experience. Work is performed under the direct supervision of higher ranking engineering staff with limited leeway for the exercise of independent judgement. Supervision is exercised over lower level technical and labor class employees; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Gladding has some experience with the City of South Pasadena Public Works as a High School Intern and graduated from the University of Buffalo with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Civil Engineering in 2023. Jonathan Gladding has completed the challenges of the duties from his former employers / schooling with enthusiasm and has performed his assignments with diligence and effectiveness. Attached is a copy of Mr. Jonathan Gladding's resume.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby appoint Mr. Jonathan Gladding, to the provisional position of Junior Engineer assigned to the Engineering Department at Range 0012, Step A-1st yr. of the White Collar union wage schedule effective September 19, 2024 with a six-month probation period and pending meeting all Civil Service rules and regulations, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

New Business #10 Approve the appointment of a Senior Engineer Assistant to the Engineering Department

15) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MOMBREA, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARIANO, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has lost two employees to other companies, agencies and retirements. In an attempt to fill the vacancies, various civil service list were called for and titles researched. With the retirement of Richard Mrugalski on October 11, 2024 the Department will have another vacancy for stormwater regulations/ district management work; and

WHEREAS, Erie County Department of Personnel request New York State Department of Civil Service to prepare a promotional and open competitive examination. This position was certified to be the appropriate

civil service title of Senior Engineer Assistant for the Town of Orchard Park based on job classifications and duties is correct. The Civil Service list was canvased and three out of the 18 candidates responded they would accept the position. The remaining responded insufficient compensation; and

WHEREAS, a lot of time has been spent by Human Resources and myself on this quest and perseverance has paid off. After interviewing several interested candidates, this appointment fills one of the vacancies with the Senior Engineer Assistant title and the need for another construction inspector; and

WHEREAS, the Senior Engineer Assistant assists in the preparation of engineering estimates; participates in surveys of physical features and stakeouts by assembling and operating equipment, taking measurements, placing stakes, holding level rod, taking sightings, and making and checking computations; conducts final survey parties or other field surveys; plots survey results manually or through the use of a computer; prepares tracings and drawings, utilizing a computer or conventional drafting techniques; operates a laboratory to test materials and gathers field samples; files drawings, engineering records and specifications; contacts vendors on engineering data and specifications; inspection of construction projects, takes measurements, calculates and records quantities; enters, checks and/or maintains data for monthly estimate payments; records other pertinent field data such as means, equipment, materials and weather, etc.; may be required to perform routine computer operation and programming; collects and organizes data related to sewer permits, house connections and related data; performs other engineering tasks consistent with design and construction projects; and

WHEREAS, the Town Engineer is pleased to inform you that after reviewing several applications, and interviewing candidates, various titles responding to the advertisements, postings, I have concluded that the best-qualified individual for the position is Daniel Thomas. Mr. Thomas has an A.A.S. in Civil Technology from Erie Community College and is currently working as a technician for Concrete Holcim, Tonawanda, New York and recently retired from the United States Army where he was a Drill Sergeant; and

WHEREAS, funding for the Senior Engineering Assistant position is included in the 2024 Engineering Department budget. Per the white collar union contract, Daniel Thomas, Senior Engineer Assistant level 009 Range 1st YR step wage of \$26.02/hr. is per the white collar union contract.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, the Town Board does hereby appoint Mr. Daniel Thomas to the position of Senior Engineer Assistant in the Orchard Park Engineering Department at Level 0009, Range 1st yr. of the white collar union wage rate schedule, effective September 30, 2024 pending meeting Civil Service rules and regulations, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

New Business #11 Appoint Peter Lukasiewicz, Engineering Department, as EBO for Federal Grant Administration as required by NYS DOT

16) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER LIBERTI, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MOMBREA, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, of May 2007, the State of New York has required the use of a web-based civil rights reporting system, called Equitable Business Opportunities (EBO), to satisfy reporting requirements related to construction and engineering projects which utilize federal funding; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has reviewed our current projects and have found a number with federal funding, which necessitates our registration with the EBO website.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby appoint Peter Lukasiewicz to the position of Senior Engineer Assistant, as the Town's liaison (Municipal EBO Officer) with the NYSDOT to handle all necessary reporting, per State guidelines as recommended by the Town Engineer.

New Business #12 Authorize the Town Supervisor to sign an agreement with Carmina Wood Design for Professional Construction Inspection of Berg Road Pump Station.

WHEREAS, the Berg Road Pump Station Replacement project has started. While the Engineering Department is capable of providing inspection services internally for the above referenced project, the current staff levels and anticipated workload cannot provide construction inspection services; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has received a proposal from Carmina Wood Design to perform the necessary inspection services with Craig Wilson to assist this Department with field construction inspection for the Berg Road Pump Station Replacement Project; and

WHEREAS, there is presently \$1,175,632.00 in Trust Account TA000 20095 for consultant work.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby authorize the Town Supervisor to sign an agreement with Carmina Wood Design; 487 Main Street, Suite 500; Buffalo, New York 14203 to provide professional construction inspection services for the Berg Road Pump Station Replacement Project at a rate of \$62.00 per hour with project mileage reimbursement at IRS rate, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

The resolution was unanimously adopted.

New Business #13 Award the Multiuse Maintenance Fuel Facility contract to L&O Mechanical Contractors

18) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER HONER, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MOMBREA, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the Bid Opening for the Multi-Use Maintenance Fuel Facility Project was held on September 12, 2024 at 2:00 PM at the Orchard Park Municipal Center, Basement Meeting Room. Six bids were received. The lowest reasonable bidder was L & 0 Plumbing & Heating, Inc., with a written total base bid of 1,978,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department and the Town Consultant Engineers, C&S Company's, have reviewed bids, checked references, and completed a de-scoping meeting on September 16, 2024. The low bidder had a mathematical error of \$500.00 difference between the numerical total and the written word lump sum value. Per the Town Attorney and bid documents, the written word governs and L & 0 Plumbing & Heating Inc. is aware of this. The company has been found to have the qualification and experience to perform the work adequately; and

WHEREAS, the work will entail the installation of 2 - 9,900 gallon above ground fuel tanks, dispensers and safety controls; associated drainage including storm water retention and quality; associated electric and communication line; installation of pavement, fencing, and restoration; and abandonment of the old tanks.

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There is presently funding allocated in Capital Account, "AB015 Highway Fuel Rehab" \$1,992,500.00 for this project.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby award the Multi-Use Maintenance Fuel Facility Contract to L & 0 Plumbing & Heating Inc., 835 Quaker Road, Macedon, NY 14502, in the amount not to exceed \$1,978,000.00, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

New Business #14 Approve PIP #2024-04 for Quaker Lake Terrace Extension 18-Lot Subdivision

19) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARIANO, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER LIBERTI, TO WIT:

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has received, from PAL Enterprises, LLC, 3375 North Benzing Road, Orchard Park, New York 14127, an application for a Public Improvement Permit to construct an extension of Quaker Lake Terrace, for "Quaker Lake Terrace Subdivision"; and

WHEREAS, the project consists of the installation of 1,490 L.F. of new roadway and public utilities to serve 18 residential sublots as shown on the location map. The project also includes stone and boardwalk/bridges, trails, bio retention and detention ponds; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has reviewed the plans and specifications for the proposed project and have found them to be in compliance with current Town Specifications and Standards. We are in receipt of all necessary fees, bond, and insurances.

NOW, THEREFORE be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby approve of Public Improvement Permit #2024-04 for Quaker Lake Terrance Subdivision, as recommended by the Town Engineer.

New Business #15 Approve the presented site plan & Authorize a Building Permit to construct a 14,400 square foot building per the recommendation of the Planning Board

20) THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION WAS OFFERED BY COUNCILMEMBER LIBERTI, WHO MOVED ITS ADOPTION, SECONDED BY COUNCILMEMBER MARIANO, TO WIT:

RESOLVED, that the Town Board does hereby approve 4000 California Road, located on the west side of California Road, across from Ellis Road Zoned I-1 (SBL #161.03-1-5.11) for the presented Site Plan and authorize a Building Permit to construct a 14,400 square foot building per the plans received on May 8, 2024 based on the following conditions and stipulations as recommended by the Planning Board on September 12, 2024:

- 1. All public notices have been filed.
- 2. This is an Unlisted Action, based on the Short EAF submitted on 12/6/24and a Negative Declaration is made.

- 3. The site lighting is limited to those fixtures and poles indicated on the approved Site Plan. Light fixtures shall have flat lenses and all lighting is to be directed downward and toward the site.
- 4. No outside storage or display is permitted.
